#### **Foreword**

This publication represents the combined efforts of staff members at the Utah State Board of Education. It is intended to be a single-source review of education-related legislation from the 2018 Legislative Session. This publication is written for state school board members, local education agency (LEA) board members, superintendents, charter school administrators, and school business administrators. It may also be useful to other public education-related organizations and to state legislators.

The main body of the publication reviews each education-related bill that was passed and identifies action that might be taken by the Utah State Board of Education, local school boards, and charter school governing boards to implement the requirements of the legislation. The publication also contains summary information on funding and bills not passed.

This publication is a service of the Utah State Board of Education, but is not intended to convey any specific direction or assignments for action by the local education agencies. The Utah State Board of Education will adopt administrative rules to implement new legislation as necessary. This publication is also not intended as a formal legal opinion or interpretation of legislative action.

#### **2018 Legislative General Session Fiscal Highlights**

#### Total Public Education Budget: \$5.16 billion

Total Minimum School Program (MSP) Funding: \$4.4 million - a 7.84% increase from FY 2018.

<u>Growth and Weighted Pupil Unit (WPU): 3.68% Increase</u> - Growth was fully funded in MSP programs (1.18%); additionally, the value of the WPU was increased by 2.5%.

<u>Enrollment Growth & WPU – \$110,548,200 ongoing & 2,556,100 one-time</u> - All LEAs will be funded on their prior year ADM plus growth. Enrollment growth was fully funded for an estimated increase of 7,681 students next year.

<u>Voted and Board Local Levy Programs Increase</u> - The Equity Pupil Tax Rate could increase the number of guaranteed local levy increments up to 20 for either the Voted or Board Local Levy Programs with appropriated funds of \$36.1 million.
